## **Mosquito Spraying Continues**

Mosquito spraying by the Town is in full force again. The Town has certified operators manning our truck and the chemicals being sprayed are meeting EPA standards. Please be on the lookout for the spray truck and keep your distance while the spraying is ongoing.

## **Golf Cart Rules of the Road**

The operator of the cart must be a licensed driver or a permit holder with a licensed driver

- ❖ The operator of the cart must NOT be impaired or consuming alcohol while driving.
- ❖ The cart must have insurance.
- ❖ The cart must have seatbelts.
- ❖ Occupants less than 16 must wear a seatbelt.
- ❖ Carts must yield the right of way to vehicular traffic
- ❖ Carts must not be operated in careless or reckless manner.
- ❖ Carts must operate headlights and taillights at night.

- ❖ Carts must display a valid inspection sticker from the Lake Waccamaw Police department.
- ❖ Inspection stickers are only valid for one year.

**Yard Waste Information:**

- Shall mean vegetative matter resulting from a resident's **normal** landscaping maintenance of service locations, such as leaves, grass, trimmings, twigs, shrubbery, plant bedding, and limbs. Limbs and trees waste shall be no greater than 5 inches in diameter and no longer than 5 feet. The total amount collected each week shall be limited to **one (1) 5' x5'x5'** area of debris. **Yard waste generated by commercial landscapers will not be collected.** Please call Town Hall to make alternative arrangements. Yard waste should be stacked neatly by the curb **in front of your house** in piles of 50 pounds or less. Yard debris **will not** be picked if located on vacant lots.

**Additional Information:**

- Please make sure you are sorting waste properly. Household trash should be bagged and placed in the refuse container.
- Please do not put recyclables in bags. Put recyclables directly in blue recycling container.
- Please do not put dirt, limbs, or construction materials in any of the containers.
- The Town will turn your water on and off once per year for winter service for free Monday through Friday. However, there is a \$50 dollar charge for this service on the weekend.
